Amazon Relief

Amazon Relief is a project of **Secular Franciscans** working together internationally. It is our calling. As secular Franciscans we have promised (Rule XIII) that we will "strive to create (for the lowly) conditions of life worthy of people redeemed by Christ." And as Christians we are called *to care for the poor* and *to carry the Good News to the ends of the earth*. Amazon Relief:

- 1. Provides immediate aid, and at the same time provides an education so as to break the cycle of poverty. Funds schools and programs to educate and assist "at risk" children (from preschool through university level). With an education, jobs are available to these children and lives are forever changed—not only for the students but also for their future spouses and children.
- 2. Programs to help high school students prepare for employment developing computer, vocational, and workplace skills. Works with employers who make available to these students apprenticeship jobs which can then lead to full-time employment.
- 3. Provides "at risk" students with music and arts programs, library and computer facilities, computer training, tutoring and help in preparing for placement exams.
- 4. Helps people spiritually as well as physically. Religious education is a part of all programs. Aid is given to build churches and schools.
- 5. Helps fund (through a new program) the cost of installing Smart TVs in remote communities that only see a priest a few times a year. Weekly Liturgies are sent from the Archdiocese as well as religious education programs.
- 6. Feeds the poor. The schoolchildren and their families as well as other families identified as having severe problems.
- 7. Assists victims of leprosy. Provides food, caretakers and home repairs to victims of leprosy and their families.
- 8. Helps fund the formation of priests and deacons. Assists dioceses with costs to train lay leaders who serve in communities where priests cannot be present on a regular basis. These lay leaders then oversee sacramental preparation and religious education programs in their communities.
- 9. Assists missionaries and lay missionaries who minister to isolated indigenous tribes.

No administrative costs are taken out of donations. All of these costs are paid by some "angels" or from bank interest to assure that 100% of donations will go to serve the poor.
