### From the Minister

"We're better together." (From the book *No Man [or Woman] is an Island* by Thomas Merton.) ..."We're made for community, for life together, as theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer puts it. Being together forms our identity. It gives us meaning and purpose and a sense of belonging. It's how we've come so far as a species. Individualism is a dead end; it goes against every aspect of our nature...Community is what Jesus formed around him in his ministry. Community is what the early Christians cultivated. Community is what we are made for; it's what God calls us to, in all of its different forms." (From Points of View, Kyle Kramer, page 42, July/August St. Anthony Messenger.)

And with this we read Rule 13: A sense of community will make them joyful and ready to place themselves on an equal basis with all people, especially with the lowly for whom they shall create conditions of life worthy of people redeemed by Christ. And Rule 22: The local fraternity is to be established canonically. It becomes the basic unit of the whole Order and a visible sign of the Church, the community of love. This should be the privileged place for developing a sense of Church and the Franciscan vocation and for enlivening the apostolic life of its members.

In our constitution, we read Article 28:1...The fraternity of the OFS finds its origin in the inspiration of St. Francis of Assisi to whom the Most High revealed the essential gospel quality of life in fraternal communion.

Our Rule and Constitution must be read and understood to live it. So, our Spiritual Assistant, Brother Jerry, will be helping us to review and understand our Rule. Please bring your copies of The Rule to our fraternity gatherings. Also remember WHY it is important to attend our monthly gatherings and be active with our service projects...this is what we professed to do.

If, for some reason, you are unable to attend our fraternity meetings, please let me know and how we can help you. If you are unable to read our newsletters or download them...let me know. Our newsletter is full of important dates and pieces of information. We are trying to keep everyone in the loop and on top of things.
