From the Minister

WHERE TO BEGIN? First, in thanksgiving for ALL of you, our Franciscan Family and Friends and OUR way of life. We have been busy bees in our service to our community and our parishes. And we are attracting others by what we do.

At the last fraternity meeting, I submitted a Fed Ex bill to our treasurer for the printing of twelve more copies of our rule and constitution to be used in our formation program. We also had twenty copies of our new membership directory made and these were handed out at our last gathering. I will also be distributing an addendum of our professed shut-ins.

On April 26th, there were six of us very competitive secular Franciscans who worked at Feed My Starving Children. We packed twenty-five boxes (that is 2/3 of a pallet of manna packs). Our next FMSC date is May 31st. Currently, we have nine brothers and sisters scheduled to participate on that date. At our gatherings in April and May, the loose change collection netted half of the \$106 needed to feed a child for a year; our fraternity paid the other half from the Common Fund. We made a donation of \$106 on April 26th and will do so again on May 31st. We received a huge thank you for the April donation. Way to go!

So what are we doing in June? We are donating Blessing Bags for Franciscan Outreach. If you are able to:

Pack five (5) one-gallon size Ziploc bags with the following items: hand sanitizer (small), hand wipes, soap or body wash and wash cloths.

Optional items can include: socks, toothpaste, toothbrush, deodorant, comb, packs of tissues, lotion or Vaseline, razors, lip balm, candy/mints.

Please bring your Blessing Bags to the June 12th fraternity meeting.

In July, our Sister Mary Kay, who attends Our Lady of the Wayside, will collect religious items (we all have so many of these) that will be sent to missionaries for their use...so be thinking of what you may want to pass on for others to use.

On July 26th, from 2:00 - 3:45 p.m., we will work at Feed My Starving Children.

Our loose change collection will be ongoing each month at our gathering to provide the funds for food to feed a child for a year.

Each month, I will also be collecting any aluminum pull tabs (from soda/soup cans), beer cans, or cat food cans. This is a collection that can be recycled and the money from recycling is used to support our Laurie Children's Hospital and their Ronald McDonald House. So let's recycle and help others!

So I end with prayers and praises for ALL the blessings in our lives and the miracles that we experience..for all the Good, the Bad and the Craziness that we are all experiencing. And a challenge from Sr. Joan Chittister, OSB, "Age does not forgive us our responsibility to give the world back to God a bit better than it was before we were here." Sounds a bit Franciscan to me...and so we shall live.

How Jesus Showed Love

During a pilgrimage to Italy, amidst the tumult of Rome, all kinds of negative comments were heard. Even if the language spoken was not understood, the meaning of the words was easily apparent because of the facial expressions and gestures of the speaker. So much criticism. So much self-righteousness. So much ego.

Then we travelled to Assisi, the home of St. Francis. An undefinable peace pervaded the entire city and countryside. For several days, we walked where Francis walked and tried to understand him a bit better, hoping to learn how to live as he did - a Gospel life. Read a Gospel passage and ponder it. Francis considered the Gospels the blueprint for living his life. What did he understand when he heard a Gospel passage? Did he only understand what Jesus said or did he also understand what Jesus didn't say?

Some of the disciples argued about who would be greater in Jesus' kingdom. Francis didn't hear Jesus say, "You idiots."

Ten lepers were cleansed. Only one came back to give thanks. Francis didn't hear Jesus say, "Those nine ingrates. I'm going to withdraw my power from them."

Jesus asked a tax collector to join his disciples. Francis didn't hear Jesus say, "On second thought, what will the Pharisees think? This won't be so good for my image."

Jesus was tender to the poor. Francis didn't hear Jesus say, "They're just lazy. I'm sure if they tried harder..."

Jesus fed five thousand. Francis didn't hear Jesus say to Philip, "You're right. They must have some money. Let them go into the villages and see what they can buy."

Jesus had compassion on the woman taken in adultery. Francis didn't hear Jesus say, "You slut. You deserve what you're getting."

Peter denied Jesus three times. Francis didn't hear Jesus say, "I know you are sorry, Peter, and I forgive you. But, maybe, I should pick someone else to head my church; I'm not sure I can trust you."

Francis saw Jesus treat every person with love, regardless of what they thought of him or how they treated him. Jesus, who was the Son of God, was never judgmental. Not only did he forgive 70x7, he gave endless chances. Francis, who wanted only to be like his Lord Jesus, did the same.
