Our Call to be a Secular Franciscan

This month we continue our stories of the path that led us to recognizing our call to become secular Franciscans. This is the story of Sister Bonnie.

As I look back now, ever since I can remember, I have been drawn to St. Francis. I can see the many ways I was being prepared for this point in my life to become a professed Secular Franciscan.

Even before joining the secular Franciscans, I was practicing the roots and ways of a secular Franciscan through the many ministries in which I served. I see this as part of my preparation all the while not really knowing this was happening to me at the time.

When difficulties arose in my life years ago, it was the pastor at my parish, Fr. Pat and, especially, Friar Johnpaul, OFM, who helped me through these hard times. They showed me that God loves me and would not abandon me. Friar Johnpaul became a dear friend, teacher and mentor in my life.

It was while I was on a pilgrimage to Assisi with him fifteen years ago that I learned that I

was being called to the secular life. In the early morning of October 4th, the Holy Spirit came over me as I entered the chapel where the tomb of St. Francis is. It was there that I was called and spoken to. It was there that I said "Yes" to St. Francis.

This experience stayed with me when we went to Mount LaVerna and I saw what St. Francis wanted me to see through his eyes. I finally knew the journey I was being asked to take. And I accepted this journey with joy and willingness. This is what I was asked to do and I was ready. My love for Jesus and St. Francis has grown so much more since my journey began and I have been part of the retreats, ministries and ongoing formation in our local fraternity and in the regional fraternity.

TRADITION/TRADITIONALISM

On April 16th, Cardinal Cupich celebrated the Chrism Mass, where the holy oils used for baptism, confirmation and ordination, and anointing of the sick are blessed. The following is part of the Cardinal's homily at that Mass:

his ministry, Throughout this Nazarene demonstrates a devotion to tradition, but in a way that is different from traditionalism. The great theologian of the past century Jaroslav Pelikan made this distinction when he observed: 'Tradition is the living faith of the dead; traditionalism is the dead faith of the living. Tradition lives in conversation with the past, while remembering where we are and when we are and that it is we who have to decide. Traditionalism supposes that nothing should ever be done for the first time, so all that is needed to solve any problem is to arrive at the supposedly unanimous testimony of this homogenized tradition' (The Vindication of Tradition, 1983 Jefferson Lecture in Humanities).
