LISTED BELOW ARE QUESTIONS FOR DISCUSSION:

- 1. Are we as seculars called to holiness? What articles in the Constitution or part of the rule calls us to this? Explain.
- 2. How do we live our commitment of faith each day? According to which rule or article in the Constitution do we see this explored? Explain.
- 3. What part does Baptism play in our calling as seculars? Which article or part of the rule shows us? Explain.
- 4. What part does conversion play in our vocation? How is this shown in the rule or article of the constitution? Explain.
- 5. What part does prayer play in our lives as seculars? What article or part of the rule speaks to this? Explain.
- 6. Do seculars show any special concern for the beatitudes? How do we do this? What articles or parts of the rule speak to this? Explain.

These questions are meant to complement the Apostolic Exhortation *Gaudete et Exultate* by Pope Francis. "Rejoice and Be Glad," the Pope's call to holiness. Jerry will be sharing parts of the message in this document with the hope that we see our Franciscan vocation in this message. The questions are a way for us to explore where in our rule and constitutions we see this message in our lives.

We see our spirituality of communion that implies also the ability to see what is positive in others, to welcome it and prize it as a gift from God. We are called in the special way to "fraternal communion" in order to support our brothers and sisters in living the Gospel and also to become a sign of Christ's presence in the world. T

Our Call to be a Secular Franciscan

This month we continue our stories of the path that led us to recognizing our call to become secular Franciscans. This is the story of our Brother Deacon Lou.

About 35 years ago a friend of mine gave me a book as a birthday present. The book was a biography of St. Francis of Assisi. I didn't realize at the time that this was the beginning of a journey, guided by the Holy Spirit.

I continued reading books about St Francis and I was continually moved by his commitment to walk in the footsteps of Jesus. In 1992 I started my Diaconate formation process, which I believe was inspired by being mentored by St. journey. Formation started Francis' Mundelein Seminary for two years and then 2 years at Trinity High School. During my two years at SML I met Patrick, OFS, who was there in formation for the "Called and Gifted" program. Needless to say my conversations with Patrick led to his evangelizing me to become a Third Order Franciscan which he was very excited about and wanted to share his story with me. It was interesting for me to hear his sharing as it peaked my experience reading about St. Francis over the past several years.

Being in the middle of my Diaconate formation I had to stay focused on that and put my interest in St. Francis on the back burner even though I kept reading about him. I believe reading about "Deacon" St. Francis during this time inspired me to follow in the footprints of Jesus as Francis did.

After my Diaconate Ordination in 1996 I was focused on my duties and ministries as a deacon, but kept reading about St. Francis and deep down desired to live a life following the Gospel message.

Fast forward to 2006 when in God's time I was led to an information night at St. Joseph's Home where the Northwest Franciscan Community of the Immaculate Heart of Mary held their monthly meetings. To my surprise one of the first persons I met was Patrick and his words to me were, "What took you so long?"

Ten years after Patrick shared his story with me, the Holy Spirit led me into the next chapter of my life as a Catholic Christian.

After the discernment process, I applied to become a Candidate, and that started my 3 years of formation to be Professed in January 2010.

As a Secular Franciscan, I try to live the "Rule" and contribute to the Fraternity as the Holy Spirit leads. Going forward is a mystery until God unfolds His plan for my life as a Deacon in His church and as a Professed Secular Franciscan.
