For a third month, the restrictions imposed on us to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 prevent us from gathering in full fraternity for formation, liturgy, and socialization. Throughout these past few months all of us have kept our fraternity brothers and sisters in thought and prayer.

A quote: We collaborate. We learn to be empathetic to people who have other ideas. We listen to each other. We talk. We have a difference of opinions. Growth is being open. We can't allow our difference of opinions to drive us apart. Come together...work together.

Our Rule 19 states: Mindful that they are bearers of peace which must be built up unceasingly, they should seek out ways of unity and fraternal harmony through dialogue, trusting in the presence of the divine seed in everyone and in the transforming power of love and pardon. We are a community of love.

Art. 26.2 of our General Constitution reads: In the fraternity, the brothers and sisters should promote mutual understanding and they should see to it that the atmosphere of their meetings is welcoming and that it reflects joy. They should encourage one another for the good.

Art. 30.1 The brothers and sisters are coresponsible for the life of the fraternity to which they belong and for the OFS as the organic union of all fraternities throughout the world.

Art. 30.2 The sense of co-responsibility of the members requires personal presence, witness, prayer and active collaboration, in accordance with each one's situation and possible obligations for the animation of the fraternity.

Art. 53.3 Insertion into a local fraternity and participation in fraternity life is essential for belonging to the OFS. Appropriate initiatives should be adopted according to the directives of the national statutes to keep these brothers and sisters united to the fraternity who for valid reasons of health, family, work or distance-cannot actively participate in community life.

The new NAFRA directives for transfers now reads that transfer requests can be requested if a member moves outside/away from their original fraternity or in the case of cessation of a fraternity.

In our fraternity, our infirmarian is in contact with our sisters who cannot actively participate in community life. She reaches out to them at least once a month. They are mailed hard copies of the fraternity newsletter and the regional Prayer and Praise.

If a fraternity member has an issue that impinges on active participation, the member should present the issue to the council and work *with* the council to resolve the issue in a way satisfactory to all.

Amid the turmoil, the Holy Spirit is at work. And so I pray, as I write this. We are stronger for our differences. We are all different....and that is a good thing. Difference of opinions should not drive us away. Our presence is so important at each and every fraternity meeting and our regional events. Profession is not the end of our formation. Profession is the beginning of a life lived in fraternity that requires regular conversion and ongoing Our Franciscan life is given formation. preference in making personal decisions. Ordinarily nothing takes preference except for special circumstances. This is true of our attendance at the regular gatherings of the local fraternity.

I'm addressing all of this, my Brothers and Sisters, because we always need to come together...not run away. We all have special gifts to offer to help our fraternity become the Kingdom of God.....living, working and praying together in fraternal harmony. The local fraternity is the primary cell of the OFS. The local fraternity is the foundation of all that is done regionally, nationally and internationally Without the cooperation and in the OFS. support of the local fraternity, the OFS would exist without a firm foundation. troubling issues may arise, our council's goal is to provide tools to live life with greater dedication.

Let's look again at Our Rite of Profession that we all pledged at the beginning of our Franciscan journey. Our Rite of Profession reads: I_____, by the grace of God, renew my baptismal promises and consecrate myself to the service of his kingdom. Therefore, in my secular state, I promise to live all the days of

my life in the gospel of our Lord, Jesus Christ in the Secular Franciscan Order observing it's rule of life. May the grace of the Holy Spirit, the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary and our holy father, St. Francis, and the fraternal bonds of community always be my help, so that I may reach the goal of perfect Christian love. Ritual, 23-24

And so I pray. Let's each of us recommit to making our fraternity more active, joyful, welcoming and prayer filled. Thank you.
