Franciscan Outreach Welcome Kits

Through the caring and cooperation of the fraternity members, Welcome Kit #2 has been completed for a homeless person who is transitioning from homelessness into a home (apartment) of his or her own. Sisters Sue G. and Kay will transport the kit down to the Outreach center in Chicago.

We will now start gathering together the items needed **Welcome Kit #3.** Below is the complete list of items needed for a kit.

When an item is purchased, the buyer should contact **Sister Faith** who has the Master List. She will then write the person's name next to the item(s) needed and purchased.

July and August are great months for purchasing items at good prices since all these items are being offered to set up college apartments and dorms.

The following items have already been bought for Welcome Kit #3:

4 place settings: plates/bowls/cups 15 piece set of frying pans, pots and pans, bakeware and utensils.

ITEMS NEEDED FOR WELCOME KITS-shopping list

Kitchen:

4 place settings: plates/bowls/cups 4 place settings flatware: forks, knives, spoons

4 each of different sizes glassware

Frying pans – large and small Saucepans w/lids – 4 qt. 2 qt. 1 qt. Bakeware: baking pans, cookie sheet Gadgets: cutting/paring knives, long handle spoons, spatulas, can opener, measuring cups and spoons

Bathroom:

Towels – bath and hand, washcloths
Bath mat, toilet brush, plunger
Shower curtain and rings
Toiletries: shampoo, soap, toothpaste,
toothbrush, deodorant, toilet paper,
tissues

Bedroom:

Twin-sized sheet sets **Twin-sized** comforter and blankets

Cleaning supplies:

10 Ways You Can Make a Difference

Be energy efficient. During the summer months, close your curtains to block heat from the sun. During the winter, open your curtains during the day to allow the sun to warm your home. These simple steps can significantly reduce the need for air conditioning and heating, which are likely the most energy-intensive aspects of your home.

Calculate your carbon footprint. Understanding which activities are carbon-intensive allows you to know to take action. **T**

The EPA has a free *carbon footprint calculator* you can use.

Adjust the thermostat. Adjusting your air conditioning or heating when you leave the house will further shrink your carbon footprint. A change of just five degrees is a good start.

Adjust your driving routine. By combining multiple errands into one trip, you reduce the amount of fossil fuel you use.

Go meatless on Fridays. Livestock production accounts for 4% of Americans' greenhouse gas, according to the EPA. By going meatless one day per week, you'll both honor Catholic teaching and better care for Creation.

Recycle more. Recycling reduces your carbon footprint both because landfills emit greenhouse gases through decomposition, and because manufacturing from scratch is carbon-intensive. Find where and how to recycle almost anything in your area at *search.earth911.com*.

Use less water. Water processing accounts for approximately 3% of energy use in the United States, according to the EPA. Saving water means saving energy. Post a "please conserve water" sign at sinks and showers, install lowflow spigots, or select the "eco" setting on laundry machines and dishwashers.

Petition policy makers. Your elected officials have the power to take action on climate change. Write policy makers to tell them that you stand for the stewardship of creation.

Write to your local newspaper. Writing a letter to the editor, has effects beyond your local community. Legislators assign their staffs to read letters to the editor as an important barometer of constituents' interests.

Form a study or action group at church. We are all strengthened when we act together as a community. Consider forming a Creation Care Team, and visit *Catholic Climate Covenant.org* for more information.
