BEING PRO LIFE

"A reminder when a politician is called 'pro life': Pro life means reverencing not just the unborn child in the womb, but also the Black person who fears for their life in their own neighborhood, the inmate on death row, the starving homeless person in our streets, the migrant family at the border, the LGBTQ teen tempted to suicide in a rejecting family, the poor family without health care in the inner city. Pro life means pro all lives, not pro some lives." Fr. James Martin, SJ

This morning (Sunday, September 27, 2020) the Gospel focuses on the parable that Jesus told about the two sons asked to go and work in their father's fields. One said he wouldn't go; then had a change of heart and went. The other son said he would go but never did.

Our pastor at Holy Family related that when he first came to the parish, he admired the green shirts worn by the maintenance staff. He really liked those shirts and after he had been at the parish for a while, he asked the head of maintenance if he could have one. Two days later, it was on his office chair. One day, he decided to wear it. As he was walking down the hallway, a long-time member of the maintenance staff teasingly said, "Don't wear the shirt, if you're not going to do the work."

"Don't use the title of minister, if you're not going to serve the fraternity." A reminder to me to do the maintenance work that needs to be done to keep us in fraternity vibrant, healthy and holy.

In the past few months, there has been an overload of horrific stories, comments, so-called "jokes", cartoons, and slurs about Black people and other races or ethnicities. They have permeated the media, emails, text messages, Facebook, Twitter, and all forms of communication. They are so numerous that they are creeping into the comments, emails and text messages of those who say they abhor Satan. These items are the work of Satan. Not of Jesus Christ who is the Lord of All and loves All. (continued on page 2)
