Mother Cabrini Celebration

The regional celebration of the Patroness of our Region, St. Frances Cabrini, will be held on Sunday, November 11, 2018, at St. Peter's Church on Madison Avenue in Chicago's Loop. Details will be in the regional newsletter.

Our fraternity will need to give a count of the members who will be attending. There will be a sign-up sheet at our October meeting.

Please note that we will also be gathering as fraternity on our usual meeting day, Monday, November 12th.

Mother Cabrini was chosen as the patroness of the region for several reasons. Sister Frances, born in Italy, founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and had set her heart on being a missionary in the Far East. Instead the Pope suggested that she "go west, not east" and serve the impoverished Italian immigrants who were flooding the United States, into cities such as New York and Chicago.

In joyful obedience to the successor of St. Peter, she herself became an immigrant on March 31, 1889, when she arrived in New York and began her work with her immigrant brothers and sisters. She was naturalized as a U.S. citizen in 1909. She encountered much disappointment and opposition when she arrived. Yet, she remained faithful to her mission. In 28 years, she founded 67 orphanages, schools and hospitals in the United States and in South America, before succumbing to dysentery. Mother Cabrini died on December 22, 1917, at Columbus Hospital in Chicago, a hospital that she had founded.

Only twenty-one years later, Mother Cabrini was beatified on November 13, 1938, after she restored the sight of a baby boy who had been blinded at birth by an overdose of silver nitrate. Eight years later, the child, Peter Smith, was present at her canonization on July 7, 1946. He later became a priest.

Thoughts About Sin

Namaste (the recognizing by one person, who holds the divine spark in their heart, of the divine spark in another person) asks something huge of us: If the divinity in me recognizes the divinity in you, how could I abuse, debase, violate, or harass? I would, after all, only be punishing myself...

St. Gregory of Nyssa (c. 335-c. 394) offered another beautiful, succinct, and useful definition of sin. *Sin*, he [suggested], *is a refusal to keep growing*. [3]

This is a growing moment. Growth is painful.

I don't believe hell or heaven to be post-life destinations. I believe they are states of consciousness largely visible here and now. A world of objects is a kind of hell. A world of subjects—divine beings honoring the divinity in the other—is surely heaven. May we point our feet toward this heaven and begin the hard and necessary work of walking there.
